Title: The Greatest

Hello Church Family,

Have you ever felt overwhelmed trying to discern God's purpose for your life? Have you ever struggled to make a decision, big or small?

You aren't alone.

The religious leaders once asked Jesus, ³⁶ "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" ³⁷ He said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' ³⁸ This is the greatest and first commandment. ³⁹ And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' ⁴⁰ On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets." Matthew 22:36-40

This summer June 15-July 20 we will be studying what Jesus called the greatest.

The Greatest Commandment Matthew 22:34-40

The Great Compassion Matthew 25:31-46

The Great Commission Matthew 28:16-20

We will focus on what Jesus described as most important to discern and live the will of God. You'll hear from Emma LaBrot offering her first sermon, Chris Ferguson, and pastor Jimmy Sansom as he describes living the great compassion through the Kairos prison ministry at the Bonne Terre prison.

You will be encouraged to practice studying this scripture by writing it out long hand and memorizing the greatest words of Jesus so that they guide you wherever God takes you. We will all be invited to discuss in small groups the Greatest teachings of Jesus during our learning hour each Sunday at 10 am around tables at the Cornerstone building with reflection questions. Consider making this discussion on Sundays at 10 am a part of your summer schedule of worship.

UPCOMING KAIROS WEEKEND - JUNE 13 - 16,

Eight years ago, Pastor Dave and members of Centenary UMC, started praying to have Kairos Prison Ministry start at the Eastern Reception Diagnostic Correctional Center (ERDCC), in Bonne Terre. Their vision was to have Centenary Walk to Emmaus members become involved with service work at the prison, to spread the love of Jesus to the men incarcerated there.

A year ago, it was only a dream. Now, after two weekends we have had 82 weekend graduates with 30-40 men attending each week for Prayer and Share, and 30-35 men attending a monthly reunion, the 2nd Saturday of each month.

For our weekend #3, June 13-16, 2025 we have over 60 residents that have filled out applications to attend this weekend. The maximum participants allowed by Kairos is 42 men, which is what we had starting both weekends #1 and #2. The remaining men are listed as alternates, in case a participant does not show, or they are put on a waiting list for the January 2026 weekend.

Currently, we only have enough team members for 30-36 residents to attend. We are praying for some more team members so that 42 residents will start the weekend.

God is doing awesome work just down the street from you! God is answering prayers in a mighty way!

Here are some ways Centenary UMC can help us with the Kairos program.

Provide Agape (Palanca) for the weekend:

- Pray We will have a 24 hour prayer vigil that people can sign up for.
- Pray We make a prayer chain that is displayed in the community room.
- Attached is a form that can be used showing the size of the links. You can print that on colored paper, then have people that are willing to pray, sign the slips with their first name only, and they can add a Bible verse if they like.
- Children can color placemats or make posters.

Write a general letter to the participants. You would write one short letter of encouragement. This would be given to Jimmy. We then email that to the Chaplain. His staff then prints a copy of the letter and gives it to each of the participants, in a booklet they can keep.

Centenary will be making a prayer chain and writing general letters to the participants.

Prepare food prior to the weekend:

- Each weekend we are providing more of the meals and eliminating eating in the prison cafeteria.
- For weekend #3 we will eat all of the meals except for one in our Community Room.
- For each meal, we are feeding about 100 people. This includes the men attending the weekend, the outside volunteers going into the prison, and about 20 Kairos graduates serving on the weekend as inside team members.
- Dozens of cookies and deserts could be made ahead of time.

We are looking for a local caterer to provide specific sandwiches for the weekend.

Centenary will be providing homemade cookies. Cookies should be dropped of at the Cornerstone on June 11th.

Meeting at Centenary on Friday, June 13:

- This is the day we go into the prison.
- We need to prepare vegetables and fruit.

Diane Moore has been in charge of this. Her number is 314-330-4798.

During the weekend:

- Several of the team members stay at the church. Others stay in hotels. Others stay in team member's houses.
- If you would be willing to house some team members it would be appreciated.

Pray for the weekend during the church services.

Attend the closing ceremony on Monday, June 16:

- Both men and women can attend the closing ceremony.
- You would be at the prison lobby at 1:00 pm and it ends at 4:00 pm.

You will hear the participants answer 3 questions: 1) What was your spiritual condition when you arrived on Friday? 2) What did you find here? 3) What are you taking with you? You will witness firsthand how the Holy Spirit worked on each participant during the weekend.

Men can become a Partner in Corrections (PIC):

- For the past year, only 4 of us have been a PIC, which allows us to attend the 2nd Saturday of the month reunions, from 1:30-3:30 pm each month, and the weekly Prayer and Share meetings, every Sunday evening from 6:30-8:30 pm. We arrive at the lobby 1/2 hour ahead of the scheduled time.
- 3 of us have been driving from St Charles and 1 from South County.
- For Prayer and Share, we leave St Charles at 4:00 and get home about 10:00 pm.
- It would be very helpful for local men to be PICs. Several times we had to cancel the meeting because of the weather, or because none of the 4 men were available. With local PICs the residents could still have met.
- Our goal is to have enough PICs so that each volunteer would only have to attend one Prayer and Share each month.
- To become a PIC you would have to have two TB tests, which can be administered for free at the prison, or free at the VA hospital for veterans, or pay about \$25 per test at a local pharmacy.

You would also have to attend a 1-day training class online.

Women can help reestablish the Kairos Outside East program:

- Kairos Outside is a 2 1/2-day event designed to support the female loved ones of men, women and youth who are, or have been incarcerated.
- Diane Moore had been involved with this program.
- The person that was mainly leading this on the East side of Missouri, Marilyn Himmelberg died, and then the Pandemic hit, and the program stopped.
- The program is still going on the West side of Missouri, in the Kansas City area.
- The Kairos Missouri State Council and the Illinois State Council are working together to reestablish this program.

 They are looking for volunteers that would be willing to set up an Advisory Council, in order to start planning how to begin the program again, which will include how to get volunteers, and how to find women to attend the weekend.

- 1. The roof replacement on the Cornerstone building is complete.
- 2. The HVAC replacement project is scheduled for May 7th (weather permitting).
- 3. The repairman for the organ in the Sanctuary has sent a few components of the organ to the manufacturer for diagnostic review. We should have more information regarding its repair in 7-10 business days.
- 4. The campaign has raised \$151,972 of the \$165,000 goal. This will afford us to pay down about 90% of the existing \$75,000 loan. The campaign end date this Sunday, May 4th. We will update you on final numbers soon after.




