Take Time to Listen for God's Purpose in Your Life

Choose today to live for Jesus Christ. Choose not to drift. Choose not to live someone else's life. Choose to live the life that God has prepared for you. "Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not rely on your own insight." Proverbs 3:5

I want to invite all of us to engage in two spiritual practices that will allow us to hear God's voice guiding and directing us towards the life God has prepared for us. One you can practice every day. The second you might practice once every year or two or three. To illustrate these two practices, I'd like to share the story of Teresa Huff. The way in which she approached making decisions demonstrates a sincere desire to listen to God's guidance to live the life God had prepared for her. I'd also like to tell you the story of how North County High School got a women's tennis team.

Every day, listen to God. Teresa grew up developing a deep faith in God through her involvement as a part of the Centenary United Methodist Church. She was in church each Sunday where she learned to read scripture, pray, and receive and give support from her church family. Every night she and her parents and sisters would have dinner together. I got the sense in talking with her family that these dinner conversations were an opportunity to reflect on the challenges and opportunities that she had encountered during the course of the day. These dinner conversations were a chance to reflect on who God was calling her to be. Teresa developed the practice of listening for God's guidance.

She learned to say “no” to some invitations so that she could say “yes” to the opportunities God was calling her to. In her first chapter of life, she said “yes” to her academic career and was successful in her studies of biology. She said “yes” to playing tennis, developing relationships on the field of sport, and lifetime health. She was so dedicated to tennis that when there was no women's team at North County, she tried out and made the men's team as a freshman. At the end of the season, the players went to the athletic director and told him they thought it was time their High School started a women's tennis program. They were tired of being beaten by Teresa. She later met the man she would marry at a tennis tournament.

More than these accomplishments in the classroom and the tennis court, Teresa was developing the ability to listen for God's guidance in the character she would embrace. She answered again and again the call to be a person of kindness.

Every day, listen to God. Throughout the generations Christians have ended the day reading a small section of scripture and asking God in prayer,

God, where did you guide me to embrace the moments and opportunities before me?

God, where did I miss the mark and sin?

End each day with the prayer that God would forgive you. Pray that God would guide you. Pray that God would give you perspective to change what needs to be changed. To embrace what needs to be embraced. To let go of what isn't yours to do. To move towards what God is calling you to pursue.

“Pay close attention to yourself and to your teaching; continue in these things, for in doing this you will save both yourself and your hearers” 1 Timothy 4:16

Take several days to listen to God. When Teresa and Alan were engaged to be married, there weren't many job opportunities in Alan's field of study in Southeast Missouri. He began a nation-wide search. Two weeks before they were to be married he received a good job offer that would require them to move to Arizona. Teresa didn't just go through the motions. She took several days to get quiet enough to hear the voice of God guiding her into this next chapter of life.

Have you noticed that the heroes of the faith all spend several days in the wilderness, away from their usual activity, so that they can get quiet enough to hear the voice of God guiding them into the next chapter of life?

Elijah spent 40 days in the wilderness and was able to hear God's direction and receive fresh insight (1 Kings 19). Jonah's hatred of the Assyrians drove him to run in the wrong direction.

After three days of prayer and repentance in the belly of the big fish, he embraced his purpose and preached salvation to the people of Nineveh. Jesus didn't begin his public ministry with a flurry of activity. He chose to begin his witness by receiving the waters of baptism and then spending 40 days in the wilderness listening to the voice of God and considering who God was calling him to be (Mark 1:12-15).

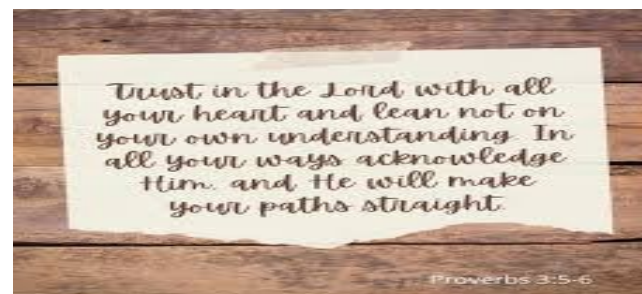
God can reveal to us what we might not be able to hear Him saying when we fill our days with activities and demands, even good demands, for our attention. Take extended time to listen to God. Surround yourself in prayer, scripture, the voices of the people you trust that have your best interests at heart. Pray and ask God to guide you in who He is calling you to be in this next season.

God can offer us guidance not just in choosing this job or that. This education program or that one. If we listen to God, He can guide us in the attitudes we should embrace to be the people He calls us to be. He can guide us at our core to be people who love God and our neighbor as ourselves.

Teresa came back from a few days of listening to God with confidence about who He was calling her to be. She and Alan choose to be married at the Centenary United Methodist Church on a Saturday. The next morning, they packed up the car and drove to Arizona to begin their life together as husband and wife. But more than a decision about where they would live, Teresa heard God calling her to be a loving wife and mother to their future children. She confidently answered God's call to be a person of faith and kindness to her family, friends, and the people God would bring into her life. For the next forty years she lived into this calling. She provided a loving home for her husband and children. When she was receiving cancer treatments, she always made sure that Alan had cash to tip the valet driver. As we prepared for her celebration of life one of her classmates wrote, "She was the kindest person in our class." The church was packed with people who had been positively impacted by her life.

Commit your life to Jesus Christ. Choose to live for Him. Ask Him each day to guide, direct, forgive, and inspire. Trust Him to lead you into a beautiful life of purpose.

2. Donate Hygiene Items

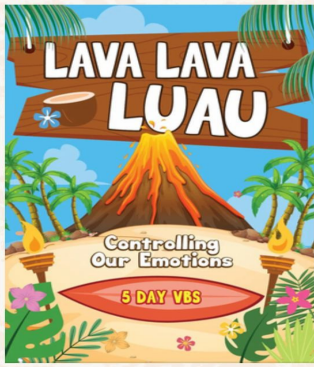
We are collecting personal hygiene items (any size but travel size) to distribute to fair-goers. Needed items include:
